

Prehistoric Teeth Activity Cards

Dinosaurs and prehistoric animals fascinate many of us – young and old. Each new discovery reminds us how little we still know about these ancient creatures. Our set of prehistoric teeth accompanied by the related activity cards tap in to the sense of wonder that many children feel about prehistoric animals. When combined these two resources will surprise and delight, while also teaching important learning points. How to use them to their best advantage is explained below.

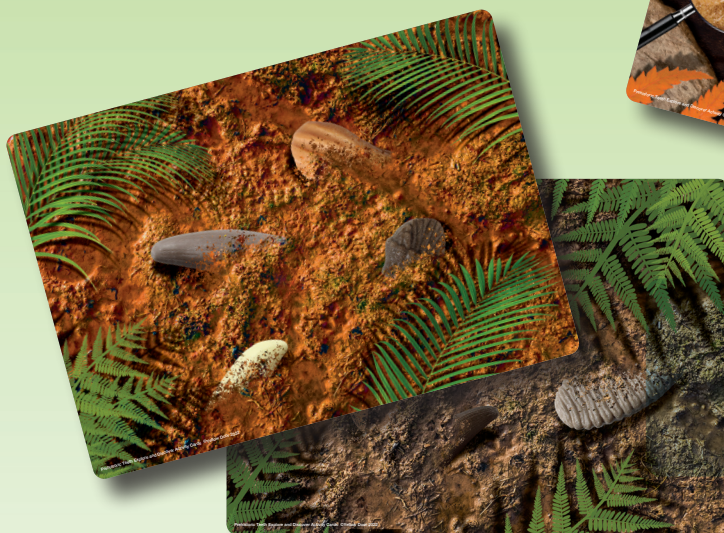


Direct match

By matching each tooth with its image, children will develop the skills that will enable them to interpret images displayed in indirect and more abstract ways.

Interpreting details

The magnified details shown on these cards require children to identify the teeth from an enlarged part of them.

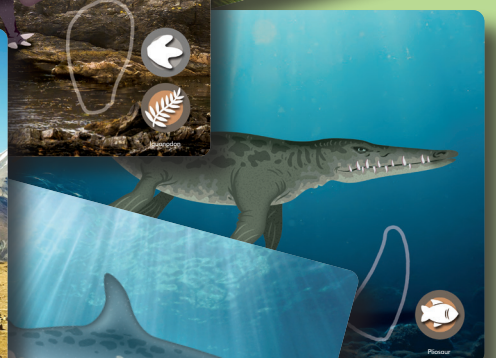


Using clues

By placing each tooth on their partially-exposed image, children will need to relate just a small element to a whole.

● Making comparisons

Comparing the size of the stone tooth to the actual tooth size shown on the card will give children an understanding of scale in a practical way. This can be extended by constructing models from building bricks to reflect these differences.



- Matching tooth to prehistoric animal
- Small world play
- Show actual size of the animals

These small-world scene cards can also be used as a standard measure. By marking out the number of cards indicated, the children will have created the dimensions of the prehistoric animal shown. Needless to say, this is best done outside!



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
